6	SERVING A HOLY KING 1 Samuel 1–7	Because God is the one holy King, he must be honored and obeyed.	I must be a servant-subject of God the King.
7	GOOD REQUEST, BAD REASONS 1 Samuel 8–12	Israel wanted a king for sinful reasons; God gave them a king for gracious reasons.	I must praise and honor Jesus, the perfect King.
8	TESTING ONE, TWO 1 Samuel 13–15	Saul failed to be the kind of king God wanted because he declared his independence of God.	I can exchange by faith my failures for Jesus' perfect obedience.
9	THE WAITING GAME 1 Samuel 16–23, 26, 31	David's path to the throne was one of suffering and waiting for God's timing.	I can rest in the knowledge of God's perfect timing.
10	BUILDING PLANS 2 Samuel 7	David wanted to build a house for God, but God built a house for David.	I must thank God for what he has done and is doing for me.
11	PAINFUL CONSEQUENCES 2 Samuel 15; Psalm 71	David had to endure the consequences of his sin, but God forgave him and preserved his covenant with David.	I must acknowledge the great price paid for my sins and praise God for his forgiveness.
12	THE GOOD OLD DAYS Selected passages from 1 Kings 4–6, 8, 10; Psalm 72; selected New Testament passages	The splendor of Solomon's reign foreshad- owed the greater glory of Christ's kingdom.	I can thank Jesus for earning me peace with God and an imperishable inheritance.
13	A SAD ENDING 1 Kings 9:1–9; 11:1–13	Despite his great blessings, Solomon broke the covenant by turning his heart after other gods.	I must identify idols in my own life and recognize my need of Jesus.
